The foundation stone of University of Agriculture, Faisalabad (UAF) was laid in 1906 with the name of Punjab Agricultural College and Research Institute, Lyallpur. It was upgraded as the West Pakistan Agricultural University, Lyallpur in 1961 and renamed as the University of Agriculture, Faisalabad (UAF) since 1973. The UAF is currently offering 165 degree programs with more than twenty thousand students from diverse background with the facility to tailor the desired unique interdisciplinary programs of learning. The UAF is transforming the community through real impact of its programs of teaching, research, technology development and outreach activities which are essential for agricultural and rural development. The UAF trains manpower to become better citizens of the country.

Student Services at Campus

Directorate of Financial Assistance and University Advancement

The Directorate of FA & UA is a hub of large number of merit and need based scholarships, financial support to the students, help in managing the fee dues, laptop distribution under various schemes, career development counseling and many more students helping activities. This is also going to be the focal place for university alumni in future.

Office of the Senior Tutor

The office of the Senior Tutor holds a key organizational position along the institutional hierarchy to manage different cultural activities within the University of Agriculture, Faisalabad (UAF). Senior Tutor works under the direct supervision of the Vice Chancellor through Principal Officer (Students' Affairs). Given the bulk and sophisticated nature of multifarious tasks his office is mandated to perform, the Senior Tutor is also assisted by two Associate Senior Tutors (both males), and five Deputy Senior Tutors (three males & two females); all of whom have their penchant recognized for the particular creative or artistic fields they pursue. Senior Tutor office makes sure that every university student has two personal tutors, a tutor and a co-tutor. Collectively, the designated Senior Tutors administer the tutorial group meetings which are conducted by 134 tutors and 134 co-tutors to promote artistic, co-curricular and cultural activities in the university. Such a supervisory and leadership role also attributes to the Senior Tutor office the status of an Art and Literary Forum, whereby it organizes exclusive as well as collaborative activities of eleven different clubs, namely Na'at and Qir'at Club, The Quiz Club, Society of Agri. Writers (SAW), The Debating Club, The Art Club, UAF Media Club, Character Building society, Young Development Corps, Rotaract Club, Road Safety Club and Virsa Music Society. Again, all of these cultural and artistic clubs thrive under the auspices of the same office. As the tutorial group meetings are targeted to explore and hone the aesthetic and creative potential of university students, a senior tutor tries to maintain close contact with students to ensure that they are managing their co- and extra-curricular activities in a way so as not to disturb their routine studies. The outstanding achievements of the students from the platform of the Senior Tutor office are also acknowledged by the University administration through special quota of scholarships. As an art and literary forum within UAF, the Senior Tutor office works out its elaborative scope in regularizing both the internal working strategies as well as outside engagements (such as co-curricular competitions at university, national and international level) of the afore-mentioned clubs. Thus, the broader framework of the Senior Tutor office seeks to ensure the implementation of proper code of ethics and practice among students while promoting and recasting Pakistani cultural values and heritage.

Office of the Principal Officer(Hostels)/Chief Hall Warden

The University is a residential institution and a very large number of female and male students reside on campus in separate residential halls located at main and PARS campuses. This office is responsible to provide accommodation to the students at campus and also maintains law and order situation in residential halls. It facilitates the students to keep in touch with their classmates, library and other on-campus facilities.

Directorate of Students' Affairs

The main objective of this directorate is to maintain law and order situation over the campus and to provide conducive environment to the students for their studies.

Foreign Students' Advisor

Foreign students are looked after by a Foreign Students' Advisor. His office arranges their meetings, conduct elections of International Club (I.C), guide them day-to-day activities and help in solving their problems. To give them healthy atmosphere, the Foreign Students Advisor also arranges sports for foreign students.

Library and Book Bank

The library represents an outstanding facility to meet the needs of the University's charter of promotion of education and research in the field of agriculture and related areas. Its featured categories include digital library, electronic library, information navigator library, global information centre, information centre, and huge number of books, periodicals, scientific journals and daily newspapers. The library functions from 8.00 a.m. to 10.00 p.m. daily.

Directorate of Sports

University provides excellent facilities to meet the indoor and outdoor requirements of sports for the students at campus. The directorate is responsible for the proper training of the students for different games and athletics for local, national and international competitions. This also helps students for keeping physical fitness.

Students/Staff Dispensary

University has separate male and female dispensaries to cater the needs of emergency and local minor ailments. Highly qualified and experienced doctors are available at campus.



Introduction of UAF Community College

To serve the community in terms of providing skilled and professional manpower, initiating various educational programs particularly for low-income underprivileged groups, and provide competent nursery for admission at undergraduate level in various disciplines of agriculture and allied subjects, University of Agriculture, Faisalabad, established UAF Community College in 2011. The main incentive was to provide education and learning facilities to the rural masses, so they could contribute towards Agriculture and Rural Economic Development of the country. The college has a spacious and beautiful architecture building situated at Jhang Road, Airport Chowk, Faisalabad.

Intermediate (Pre-Agriculture) is a signature program of the college. The program was revived in 2009 with main thought to improve ownership for agriculture. The beauty of this program is its merit-based admission, with 75% intake from rural areas, from all districts of Punjab. Additionally, there are reserved seats for nominees of Sindh, KP, Balochistan, AJK, FATA, Gilgit -Baltistan, children of UAF employees, and children of overseas Pakistanis. Admission to Intermediate (Pre-Agriculture) is actually meant secured admission to any of the ongoing 25 degree programs of the University.

The promising features of this program are highly-qualified and experienced faculty, mostly possessing Ph.D. degree from abroad, calm and serene teaching campus, provision of audio/visual aids in lecture theatres, well-equipped laboratories, experimental fields, student's counselling activities, participation in scientific exhibition, seminars, health facilities, extended playgrounds, and hostel accommodation next to the campus building, which together make the UAF Community College the best one in town. For the benefit and support of rural community, the university administration has reduced the program fee and allowed free education for its top and talented students.

Minimum eligibility criteria for admission to Intermediate (Pre-Agriculture): Secondary School Certificate examination (SSCE) with Science subjects securing at least 50% marks (without 20 marks of Hafiz-e-Quran) not more than two years before (2015 to 2017). The age limit is 18 years on 1st September, 2017.

In addition to this, Community College offers three Associate Degrees in Feed Technology, Farm Management, and Education. An Associate Degree is a two-year post-intermediate degree to be awarded by public & private universities/DAIs primarily in market-driven subjects based on local and regional community and industry needs. The Associate Degree is equivalent to BA/BSc (Pass) degree. The immediate link of the associate degree with the requirements of the market is a core objective of this program. The degree, developed to respond, fulfils the needs of industry.

In view of the regional needs, Community College started Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) with Credit Earning and Credit Transfer Facility.

In order to cater the needs of community, in particular employed people, Community College also offers Weekend Programs, which include M.Phil. (Education), M.Sc. (Mathematics), M.Sc. (Economics), M.Com., M.A. (English), M.Ed., M.A. (Education), and M.A. (Sociology).

Minimum Eligibility Requirements for B.Ed.

Graduation (14 years schooling) from HEC recognized University/Institution, any degree program of this University/BCS (Hons.) or B.Sc.(Hons.) with any discipline in Physics, Chemistry, Biology (Zoology, Botany)/Math/Computer Science, or M.Sc. in any mentioned discipline with two year graduation securing at least 45% marks under annual system or CGPA of 2.50/4.00 under semester system.

- The students enrolled in any degree program at this University are also eligible to apply in this program through credit earning system. The morning students pursuing their higher degrees in the vicinity of Faisalabad who fulfill the minimum requirements for admission to this degree will also be eligible to apply and continue (if admitted on merit) the evening program of studies i.e. B.Ed.
- Merit for admission in this degree program shall be determined on the basis of percentage of marks (calculated upto three decimals) in the degree program which is a requirement for admission to B.Ed.

Hafiz-e-Quran Test:

In case of certificate/degree programs (except in-service teachers of Associate degree in Education and B.Ed.), the candidates desirous to claim 20 marks being Hafiz-e-Quran, would have to appear for test/interview irrespective of the fact that he/she has Hafiz-e-Quran certificate. For the purpose while submitting application form on open merit, they would be required to submit prescribed registration application as per specimen available in the Office of Principal upto the last date advertised in the National Press. On the next day of expiry of last date, such applications complete in all respects will be forwarded to the Director Students' Affairs under covering letter to proceed further into the matter.

On receipt of applications, the test/interview of the candidates will be conducted by the Director Students' Affairs in his office located near main cafeteria adjacent to main library at main campus as per schedule published in the National Press. **It is made clear that no separate test/interview will be conducted for a candidate who could not appear on the scheduled date and time under any circumstances.** After conducting test/interview, the list of qualified/failed/absent candidates will be communicated under confidential cover to the Principal by the Directorate of Students' Affairs. The concerned

admission authority will carefully check/ensure that 20 marks have been added in the marks of last examination while preparing merit, only in the case of candidates who have declared as pass/qualified the test/interview as indicated against their names in the list received from Director Students' Affairs office. The candidates who fail to qualify/pass the test/interview and names not included in the requisite list, will be placed in the merit list according to their marks secured in last examination without 20 marks, irrespective of the fact that they have attached any type of Hafiz-e-Quran certificate or not.

Age limit:

For Intermediate (Pre-Agriculture) upper age limit is 18 years 1st September, 2017. There is no age limit for admission to Associate and B.Ed. degree programs. However, the upper age limit condition where applicable can be relaxed on the recommendations of the Principal by the Vice Chancellor, if selected provisionally. Such applicants are required to submit a request addressed to the Vice Chancellor on plain paper alongwith application form. However, the Principal may refuse to consider the request for relaxation.

For rural candidates:

The district of a candidate will be determined from the name and place of School indicated in the Matric Certificate. If the school is situated within the premises of a District Headquarter, the candidate will be considered as Urban and the rest of the candidates will be considered as Rural.

Instructions for reserved seats and documentary evidences required for each category:

The candidates applying for reserved seats should attach attested copies of the certificates mentioned against each in addition to other documents as detailed below:-

i.	Children of Overseas Pakistanis	National Identity Card of Overseas Pakistanis (NICOP) issued by NADRA in the name of father/guardian (if father not alive).
ii.	Children of University employees(teachers and others)	Prescribed certificate issued by the Personnel Section (in case of teachers) and Establishment Section (in case of other than teachers).
iii.	Nominees of Other Provinces(Including AJ&K, FATA and Gilgit -Baltistan)	Should contact the respective Department of their Government for nomination. However, they can also apply under Evening College category without nomination.

Admission application forms:

The blank admission application forms are available in this brochure which can be obtained from the admission office situated at old National Bank building and the Habib Bank Limited, University Branch at Faisalabad, on cash payment.

Downloading of Application Form:

The application form is also available at the University website <http://www.uaf.edu.pk>. → Admission → Intermediate. The interested candidates may download the application form and by attaching bank draft/pay order equal to price of brochure in addition to requisite documents submit it in the Office of the Principal, UAF Community College or at Central Admission Office by hand or through post upto the last date. The draft/pay order of requisite price should be in favour of the Treasurer, University of Agriculture, Faisalabad, prepared by any scheduled Bank. The downloaded form without DD/Pay order will be rejected without prior intimation being incomplete.

Submission:

The prescribed application form must be submitted to the admission office upto the date published in the National Press. The name of the category in which a candidate seeks admission must be clearly indicated in the admission form. No one will be allowed to add or change the name of the category after submission of application. However, their admission will be carried out on the basis of documentary evidences attached with the form. In case the candidates possessing equal marks and standing at the tail of the merit list, preference for admission will be given to the older one.
