However the volume must not exceed two pages. Only selected abstracts (after peer review) will be considered for oral presentation or poster and will also be included in proceedings book. Proceeding book will be provided free of cost along with conference package. The dead line for abstract submission is October 15, 2015.

Conference Language

Language for oral presentations, poster presentation and professional discussions will be English. However cultural events will be mixed with Urdu/Punjabi.

About Faisalabad

Faisalabad, is the third largest city in Pakistan after Karachi and Lahore. It was one of the first planned cities within British India. It is a major industrial center of Pakistan. The city is also referred to as the "Manchester of Pakistan" because it is a major contributor towards Pakistan's GDP, contributing over 20%. Faisalabad is a major producer of superphosphates, cotton and silk textiles, hosiery and agricultural equipment.

Faisalabad has a number of well know agricultural research institutes, especially University of Agriculture Faisalabad previously known as Punjab Agriculture College (1906-1961), Ayub Agricultural Research Institute (AARI), Nuclear Institute of Agriculture and Biology (NIAB) and National Institute of Biotechnology and Genetic Engineering (NIBGE).

Weather

In November the weather is quite mild and the average night temperature is 11 °C and average day temperature is 25 °C. Please take comfortable light winter clothes.
