Mr. Patrick Nolan is Director of Development in the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences at the University of California Davis. In this role, he manages a portfolio of major donors and prospects, alumni, corporations, foundations, and friends who have vested interest in the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (CA&ES) at the Major Gift level. Within CA&ES he has particular responsibility for raising funds for the Department of Biological and Agricultural Engineering and the Agricultural Sustainability Institute. Mr. Nolan came to UC Davis from the Ohio State University (OSU) where he managed a portfolio of Major Gift prospects for the College of Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences, as well as acting as fundraising liaison for OSU Extension, 4H as well as in Energy Development. Earlier he held fundraising positions at Muskingum University, with special responsibility in the research and identification of prospects capable of major gifts, and at Clemson University, where among other achievements he helped develop the first young alumni program.

Mr. Patrick Nolan brings a wealth of experience specific to fundraising for universities with teaching, research and agricultural missions in the agriculture and environmental sciences.

Mr. Nolan will arrive at University of Agriculture, Faisalabad on Monday, 7 March for a week filled with activities exploring fundraising at UAF and sharing his knowledge and experience from UC Davis and elsewhere. He will be conducting individual interviews, focus groups with alumni, stakeholders and students, as well as a number of strategy and training sessions. He will deliver a public seminar on Thursday, 10 March, 10:00 AM in the new Senate Hall.
