

RULES AND REGULATIONS

(A) THE STATUTES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE FIRST DEGREE AWARDED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF AGRICULTURE, FAISALABAD.

I. STATUTES

1. In these Statutes unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context;
 - (i) "*Audit Course*" means a course attended without any liability of taking its examination.
 - (ii) "*Credit Hour*" means the successful completion of a course of one semester hour in theory or 2-3 semesters hours in practicals per week. One credit hour will be equal to 50 minutes student teacher contact per week for 16 weeks and for laboratory/practical work its duration will be 2-3 hours.
 - (iii) "*Credit Hour*" means the successful completion of a course of one semester hour in theory or 2-3 semesters hours in practicals per week. One credit hour will be equal to 50 minutes student teacher contact per week of 16 weeks and for laboratory/practical work its duration will be 2-3 hours.
 - (iv) "*Deficiency Course*" means a course in which a student has been adjudged deficient by a competent body of the University.
 - (v) "*Non Credit Course*" means a course of study, successful completion of which would not be a requirement for the degree.
 - (vi) "*Semester*" means teaching time of 19 weeks inclusive of admission, conduct of examination, preparation and declaration of results etc. and gazetted holidays.
2. **Duration of the Course**
 - (i) The minimum number of semesters for completing the course for the degree of Bachelor of Science(Hons.) Agricultural Sciences, Bachelor of Science in Agricultural Engineering, Bachelor of Science (Hons.) Agricultural and Resource Economics, Bachelor of Science (Hons.) Food Science & Technology and Bachelor of Science (Hons.) Home Economics shall be eight. Provided that in case a student does not qualify for the award of degree within the minimum period of eight semesters, he may continue his studies for a maximum of four consecutive semesters beyond which he shall not be eligible for enrolment. In case of Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree, the minimum duration for completing degree programme shall be ten semesters. However, a student who fails to complete degree within the minimum duration, may further continue his studies upto four consecutive semesters beyond which he shall not be eligible for any enrolment.
 - (ii) The medium of instructions and examinations shall be English except in the case of Islamic Studies, which shall be Urdu.
3. **Duration of Semester**
 - (i) There will be two semesters in each academic year, winter and spring of 19 weeks each. The commencement of the semesters is regulated by the Academic Council.
(Explanation: Out of 19 weeks, 16 weeks shall be the actual teaching time, the rest may be utilized for admission, conduct of examinations, preparation and declaration of results etc.).

- (ii)* There will also be a summer session of 8 to 10 weeks duration as part of an academic year, and shall be optional. Students who wish to pass "F" grade(s) and to improve "D" grade(s) course(s) may enrol only in the terminal summer session in the courses offered. It shall not count towards residential requirements.

Explanation

- (i) In summer session double classes will be held to compensate the normal study hours of a regular semester.
- (ii) The 'F' and 'D' grade course(s) will be enrolled in the regular semester(s) as per approved 'Scheme of Studies' subject to maximum admissible limit of semesters. However, 'F' and 'D' grade course(s) will be allowed to enroll only in the terminal summer session upto the prescribed limit of credit hours to those students who would complete the degree requirement after that enrolment.

* The above amendment in Statute 3(ii) read with its explanation will be effective from the academic session, 2009-10 for the students newly admitted in all 1st degree programmes.

4. Scheme of Study

The schemes of study for various degree examinations shall be as given in the Schedule appended to the Statutes. This schedule may be amended from time to time.

5. Minimum Requirements for various Degrees

The minimum credit requirement for instituting the various degrees shall be as follows:

B.Sc.(Hons.) Agri. Sciences: Agriculture /Agricultural & Recourse Economics/ Food Science & Technology and Animal Science	150 credit hours for a duration of 8 semesters
Doctor of Veterinary Medicine	207 credit hours for a duration of 10 semesters.
B.Sc.(Hons.) Home Economics	149 credit hours for a duration of 8 semesters.
B.Sc. Agricultural Engineering	149 credit hours for a duration of 8 semesters.



II REGULATIONS

1. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

i. Minimum Academic Requirements

A candidate seeking admission to the following first degree courses must have passed the examination shown against each course or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto from a recognized institution securing at least 45% marks i.e. 495/1100 and for B.Sc. Agricultural Engineering course 50% marks i.e. 550/1100 obtained in the academic courses prescribed excluding 20 marks each of NCC and Hafiz-e-Quran; provided further that the requirement of minimum marks may be amended from time to time by the Academic Council. The admissions to B.Sc.(Hons.) Agri. Sciences: Agriculture/Agricultural & Recourse Economics/Food Science & Technology and Animal Science, shall be made on the basis of common 'Scheme of Studies' for first four semesters. On completion of four semesters, the candidates have a choice for admission to any of the above degree programmes which will be exercised on the basis of their Cumulative Grade Point Average(CGPA) and preference at the end of four semesters and availability of seats in the respective degrees:

(a) B.Sc. (Hons.) Agri. Sciences:
Agriculture/Agricultural & Resource
Economics/ Food Science &
Technology/Animal Science

Intermediate Science (Pre-Medical) provided that a minimum of 75% of the admission to be made on the basis of open merit or district merit shall be from the candidates with rural back-ground to be determined as under:

1. Applicants who are sons/daughters of the owners of agricultural land shall submit the latest revenue document (**نقل فرد جمعندی**) issued by the Patwari and countersigned by the Tehsildar of the same year in which the admission is being sought on rural background basis, alongwith their applications indicating the ownership of the land and the domicile of the same district. Such certificate issued/signed by any other agency/person shall not be accepted in any case.
2. Applicants who are sons/daughters of such persons who do not own land but cultivate as tenants/sharecroppers should submit the latest revenue document (**نقل خسرہ گرداوری**) issued by the Patwari and countersigned by the Tehsildar of the same year in which the admission is being sought on rural background basis, alongwith their applications indicating the tenancy of the land and the domicile of the same district. Such certificate issued/signed by any other agency/person shall not be accepted in any case.
3. Applicants who are sons/daughters of such persons who neither own agricultural land nor work as tenants, but live in villages, should produce a latest certificate of residence in village (**نقل سرٹیفکیٹ سکنی**) issued by the Patwari and countersigned

- (b) B.Sc. (Hons.) Home Economics
- (c) Doctor of Veterinary Medicine
- (d) B.Sc. Agricultural Engineering

by the Tehsildar of the same year in which the admission is being sought on rural background basis, along with their applications indicating the permanent residence and the domicile of the same district. Such certificate issued/signed by any other agency/person shall not be accepted in any case.

Intermediate Science (Pre-Medical).
Intermediate Science (Pre-Medical).
Intermediate Science (Pre-Engineering)/Licentiate from a Poly-Technic Institute holding a three years diploma.

Note: 75% of the seats in D.V.M. are to be filled on open merit basis from the candidates having rural background to be determined as given in the (a) above.

ii. Age

A candidate must not be more than 23 years of age on 1st September of the year of admission; provided that the Vice Chancellor may relax age limit in very exceptional cases on the recommendations of the respective Dean/Director/Head of Sub-Campus concerned.

iii. Domicile

- a The candidate domiciles in other Provinces but passing Intermediate examination from the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education of the Punjab may be considered for admission against Provincial quota of the respective Province.
- b The candidates who are domiciled in the Punjab but have passed their Intermediate examination from Boards other those in the Punjab may be admitted on merit on production of domicile certificate.

2. Numbers to be Admitted

The Academic Council shall determine the number of students to be admitted in each course under various categories.

3. Authority of Admission

The admission may be made by Dean/Director/Principal/Head of Sub-Campuses concerned for admission to Doctor of Veterinary Medicine, B.Sc.(Hons.) Agriculture at D.G. Khan and Depalpur Sub-Campuses, B.Sc. Agricultural Engineering and B.Sc.(Hons.) Home Economics degree programmes respectively. In the case of admission to B.Sc. (Hons.) Agri. Sciences: Agriculture/Agricultural and Resource Economics/ Food Science & Technology and Animal Science, the following Admission Committee will be the competent Authority:-

1. Dean, Faculty of Agriculture	Convener
2. Dean, Faculty of Agri. Economics & Rural Sociology	Member
3. Dean, Faculty of Animal Husbandry	Member
4. Director General, National Institute of Food Science & Technology	Member

4. Deficiency

If the schedule of courses pursued by a candidate does not provide adequate background for the 1st degree course which he intends to take up, he may be required to make up the deficiency by taking one or more additional course(s) of deficiency level as may be prescribed by the Dean/Director/Head of Sub-Campus concerned.

5. Time for Admission

- (i) Candidates may be admitted at the beginning of the Winter Semester. If a candidate fails to enrol, his admission shall stand cancelled.
- (ii) The Dean/Director/Head of Sub-Campus concerned may refuse admission to a student without assigning any reason.

6. Enrolment

- (i) A candidate admitted to the course shall for so long as he has not completed all the requirements for the degree, enrol himself for each semester subject to the maximum admissible limit of 12 semesters in case of B.Sc.(Hons.) Agriculture/B.Sc. Agricultural Engineering/B.Sc. (Hons) Food Science & Technology/B.Sc. (Hons) Agricultural and Resource Economics and B.Sc.(Hons.)

Home Economics, 14 semesters in case of D.V.M. and the summer session immediately following, failing which his admission shall stand cancelled. In case a student discontinues without permission, he may seek readmission, in the same semester next year, with the approval of the Vice Chancellor and on the recommendations of the Dean/Director concerned/Head of Sub-Campus; or the subsequent year with the permission of the Academic Council, provided that he has not already exhausted the maximum residential requirements for the course, and provided further that after the first eight semesters in case of B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture/B.Sc. Agri. Engineering/B.Sc. (Hons.) Food Science & Technology/B.Sc. (Hons) Agricultural & Resource Economics/B.Sc.(Hons.) Home Economics and ten semesters for D.V.M, a candidate may enrol in the semester in which his/her failing/remaining subject(s) is/are offered in accordance with his/her "Scheme of Studies" subject to the maximum admissible limit of 12 and 14 semesters as the case may be. Provided further that the semester following after completion of course work of the degree programme, shall be meant for internship only.

Clarification of Statute 2(i) and Regulation 6(i)

The four semesters provided in excess of the normal duration of the course have to be treated as exactly identical to the original minimum duration in matters of regulating the course conduct. This provision does not place any bar on the students' right to discontinue their studies during these extra four semesters. But what is inviolable in their case is their consecutive nature. One cannot skip a semester during this extra period and recover it beyond the maximum admissible semesters after it has ended. For instance, if a student of B.Sc.(Hons.) Agriculture/B.Sc. Agricultural Engineering/B.Sc. (Hons.) Food Science & Technology /B.Sc. (Hons) Agricultural & Resource Economics/B.Sc.(Hons.) Home Economics discontinues studies in the 11th semester, and the course in question is not offered in the next 12th semester, he/she cannot claim a right to further enrol in the next(13th) semester, except that he/she avails himself/herself of the terminal summer session. He/she has come to the end of his/her studies. The law provides him/her no further chance. As the minimum duration of D.V.M. course shall be 10 and the maximum 14 semesters for completion of degree programme, therefore, on the above analogy, the students of this degree course shall not be eligible to enrol beyond 14th semester except terminal summer session. Provided further that the semester following after completion of course work of the degree programme shall be meant for internship only where applicable as per approved 'Scheme of Studies'.

- (ii) An application for enrolment on the prescribed form(UG-I) accompanied by the prescribed fee receipt, shall be presented by regular students on the days notified for the purpose; provided that the Dean/Director/Head of Sub-Campus concerned may, in special circumstances and on payment of a late fee mentioned under the Chapter "Fee Funds & Other Charges" sub-heading (b) common fee permit a student to enrol within seven days after the commencement of semester.

Provided further that the Vice Chancellor may allow enrolment of a student after the expiry of seven days of the commencement of classes under special circumstances of individual cases to be recorded in writing with double late fee, till such time as it does not conflict with the prescribed requirement of 75% attendance in lectures and practicals of each subject.

Provided further that the students seeking admission for the first time in any of the first degree courses must complete all admission/enrolment formalities within the dates notified by the Dean/Director/Head of Sub-Campus, failing which their admission shall stand cancelled; provided further that the admission of such students may be allowed, in consultation with the Vice Chancellor till such time as it does not conflict with the prescribed requirements of 75% attendance in lectures and practicals of each subject.

Explanation: Enrolment will only be considered completed when UG-I form is deposited with the concerned Dean/Director/Head of Sub-Campus. Merely depositing of fee will not serve the purpose.

- (iii) Withdrawal of the course(s): A student may be allowed to change the course(s) within 7 days from the commencement of the semester and to withdraw from a course within 5 weeks of the commencement of the semester with the consent of the Advisory Committee.
- (iv) Minimum and Maximum Credit Hours: Each student shall register himself/herself in the first and second semester for all the credit hours prescribed for these semesters. Subsequently he/she shall have to register for courses carrying not less than 17 and not more than 27 credit hours for all degree programmes except B.Sc.(Hons.) Agri. Sciences for which the limit is 20 to 23 respectively. The students who wish to pass 'F' and to improve 'D' grade(s) may enrol in regular semester(s) as per approved 'Scheme of Studies' subject to maximum admissible limit of semesters. In his/her last semester a student may register himself/herself for the courses carrying the remaining credit hours; provided that the maximum does not ordinarily exceed 30 credit hours for all degree programmes except B.Sc.(Hons.) Agri. Sciences for which the maximum limit is 24 to 27 credit hours; Provided further that the Dean/Director/Principal concerned may allow a student to exceed the maximum limit by 1 to 4 credit hours for all degree programmes except B.Sc.(Hons.) Agri. Sciences by which he/she may be falling short of the total prescribed credit hours of a course, in special circumstances to be determined carefully in each individual case. In the case of B.Sc.(Hons.) Agri. Sciences the maximum limit is 1 to 3 credit hours. These extra credit hours shall be allowed only in the 6th and 7th semesters to the students of B.S.(Hons.) Agri. Sciences, 7th and 8th semesters to B.Sc. (Hons.) Home Economics, B.Sc. Agricultural Engineering and 8th and 9th semesters to the students of D.V.M. course. However, 'F' and 'D' grade

course(s) will be allowed by the Dean/Director/Principal to enrol only in the terminal summer session upto a maximum of 16 credit hours subject to the condition that a student would complete the degree requirement after that enrolment; Provided further; that no course shall be offered during the regular semester which does not fall within the "Scheme of Studies" in the respective semester.

Clarification of Regulation 6(iv)

- A. Regular semesters
- i. Each student shall register himself/ herself in the first and second semesters for all the credit hours prescribed for these semesters.
 - ii. Subsequently, he/she shall have to register for courses carrying not less than 17 and not more than 27 credit hours for all degree programmes except B.Sc.(Hons.) Agri. Sciences for which the limit is 20 to 23 credits.
 - iii. In his/her last two semesters as the case may, a student may register himself/herself for the courses carrying the remaining credit hours i.e. upto 30 credit hours extendable upto 34 credit hours for all degree programmes except B.Sc.(Hons.) Agri. Sciences in special circumstances to be determined by the Dean/ Director/ Principal concerned in each individual case. In the case of B.Sc.(Hons.) Agri. Sciences extended limit is 24 to 30 credit hours. This will however, be subject to the condition that after enrolling these extra credit hours, the student will complete the degree programme. Provided that after enrolment of extra credits hours i.e. 30 to 34 and 24 to 30 as the case may be in his/her last semesters, if a student is still not completing his/her degree programme, he/she will enrol the courses of normal limit of 23 credit hours in case of B.Sc.(Hons.) Agri. Sciences and 27 credit hours in case of other degree programmes.
 - iv. The 'F' and 'D' grade course(s) will be enrolled in the regular semester(s) as per approved 'Scheme of Studies' subject to the maximum admissible limit of semesters.

(B) Summer Sessions

- i. In Summer session double classes will be held to compensate the normal study hours of a regular semester.
- ii. In terminal summer session following 8th, 10th and 12th regular semester for the students of B.Sc. (Hons.) Agri. Sciences/B.Sc. Agricultural Engineering/ B.Sc. (Hons.) Home Economics and 10th, 12th and 14th regular semester for D.V.M. students, a student may enrol 'F' and 'D' grade course(s) upto a maximum of 16 credit hours provided that he/she completes his/her degree programme after that session. However, in case a student has yet to qualify 'F' and 'D' grade course(s) of more than 16 credit hours for completion of degree programme, he/she may enrol these course(s) in the forthcoming regular semester(s) as per 'Scheme of Studies' subject to the maximum admissible limit of semesters.

7. Constitution of Advisory Committees

The Dean/Director/Head of Sub-Campus shall constitute Advisory Committees in their respective Faculties/Division/ Institutes/Sub-Campus to provide adequate counselling and guidance to the students in the selection of their courses and other related matters.

8. Number of Courses

The courses will be numbered to a scheme such as B.Sc.(Hons.) Agriculture 1st and 2nd semester (301-400),

3rd and 4th (401-500) and so on. This number will be preceded by two to four letters indicating the field of study i.e. AGRON-310(Agronomy-310).

9. Improvement of 'D' Grade

- (i) In the third semester or in any of the subsequent semesters a student may repeat once those courses of the previous semester(s) in which he/she had secured the lowest grade i.e. 'D' only.
- (ii) Any improved grades will substitute 'F' and 'D' grades of the previous semester for calculating CGPA but 'F' and 'D' grades will form part of the transcript.

10. Examination and Weightage

- (i) A midterm examination for one hour duration will be held during 9th week of the semester which shall carry 30% of the total marks allocated for the course. This examination shall be held by the teachers concerned who shall determine the form of the examination.
- (ii) In addition, quizzes, special home assignments and/or term papers shall carry 10% of the total marks allocated which shall uniformly split over the whole semester.
The final examination to be held at the end of the semester shall carry 60% of the total marks allocated.
- (iii) For the purpose of evaluation, one credit will carry 20 marks e.g. a 5 credit course will carry 100 marks. These marks will be divided in accordance with the credit assigned to Theory/Practical of each course.

11. Uniformity/Standard in Tests

In each Department the respective Boards of Studies will examine all problems regarding uniformity/standards in tests, examinations, assignments etc. before the declaration of results for the semester, or any appeal from the student or teacher of any other related matter. The decision of the Board shall be final. The students will be permitted to go through their answer books in the presence of teachers concerned within 3 days before the award list is sent to the Controller of Examinations.

12. Practical Examination

The practical, each laboratory experiment, exercise, operation etc., shall be considered an examination and 40% marks shall be assigned for overall general performance and 60% for the final examination.

13. Declaration of Result

- (i) The result of all the examinations shall be completed and delivered within 7 to 10 days of the date of examination under sealed cover to the Controller of Examinations at the end of each semester.
- (ii) One copy of the award of each subject shall be forwarded to the Chairman of the Department/Dean/Director/Head of Sub-Campus concerned under sealed cover.
- (iii) GPA / CGPA at the end of 1st, 2nd and subsequent semesters:
At the end of first semester a student securing GPA less than 0.5 shall cease to be on the rolls of the University. He/she may, however, again seek admission in any degree course, for which he/she is otherwise eligible at the next following admission time, on merit; provided that this concession will be admissible to him/her only once. The student must get a

minimum CGPA of 0.75 at the end of the second semester and a minimum CGPA of 1.00 at the end of any of the subsequent semester so that the student feels impelled to get the minimum CGPA of 2.20 required for qualifying for the award of the degree, failing which he/she would cease to be on the rolls of the University and shall not be re-admitted afresh in any degree programme of the University.

- (iv) *Calculation of GPA/CGPA* will be calculated at the end of each semester in accordance with the relevant Regulations.

14. Minimum Pass Marks

In order to complete a course successfully, a student is required to obtain at least 40% marks each in Theory and Practical separately.

15. Grade Point Average

- (i) Grade points will be as follows:
4 for A, 3 for B, 2 for C, 1 for D and Zero for F or failure. W for withdrawal and I for Incomplete may also be used.

Minimum grade point average for obtaining a degree 2.20

- (ii) The grade point will be worked on the basis of percentage of marks obtained by a student in each course separately according to conversion table and not on the percentage of total marks obtained by a student.

16. Attendance Requirements

- (i) A candidate with less than 75% of the attendance in Theory and Practical of each course separately shall not be allowed to take the final examination of the course in a semester. Provided that the period of absence in the case of participation in co-curricular/sports activities outside Faisalabad/D.G. Khan, with the permission of Dean/ Director/Head of Sub-Campus concerned may not be counted.
- (ii) The teacher concerned shall send to the respective Dean/Director/Principal through the Chairman of the Department, a statement of daily attendance of students in each course, Theory and Practicals separately on the prescribed form. The Dean/Director/Principal concerned shall strike the name off the students from the rolls who is absent from the classes continuously for a week without prior permission of the respective competent authority.

Provided that a student whose name has been struck off the University rolls due to said continuous absence may seek re-admission with the permission of the Dean/Director/ Principal concerned upto the time within which he/she could complete prescribed attendance requirements in lectures and practicals of each subject separately. If a student fails to do so, he/she will be considered as discontinued studies without prior permission of the competent authority and his/her request may be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of relevant Regulations.

17. Conduct of Examination

- (i) The final examination of each course (Theory and Practical) shall be held during the last week of a semester at a time and

place to be notified by the Chairman of the Department/Dean of Faculty/Director of Division/Head of Sub-Campuses.

- (ii) All teachers teaching the various sections of a class will set their individual examination papers and submit them to the Department Chairman who shall set the final single paper from the examination papers so submitted by the sectional teachers. The answer books will be marked by the respective teachers individually or collectively as may be determined by the Department's Chairman/Deans/ Director/Head of Sub-Campus. The Chairman of the Department will arrange the supervision of the examination of the course, marking of the answer books and preparation of award lists.
- (iii) If a student enrolled in a semester has discontinued or is unable to sit in the final examination due to illness duly certified by a Registered Medical Officer or under the circumstances beyond his/her control, to be determined in each case, on a **written application by the student, may be allowed to discontinue** which would be **duly notified** by the Dean of the Faculty/Director/Head of Sub-Campus concerned. He/she may, however, enrol in the same semester the following year, with the permission of the Dean/Director/ Head of Sub-Campus **or the subsequent year but with** the permission of the Academic Council.

18. Marks/Grade of Deficiency Course

The marks/grade required to pass a deficiency course shall be the same as in the regulations relating to the examination/course concerned.

19. Script of Examinations

The script of each examination may be shown to the students by the concerned teacher taken back immediately and then forwarded to the Controller of Examinations within three weeks, who shall preserve the scripts for a year. If a mistake or a discrepancy in the marking of the scripts of a serious nature comes to the notice of the Controller of

Examinations, he shall take action to get it rectified in a suitable manner after obtaining proper orders from the Vice Chancellor.

20. Examination Fees

University examination fee shall be charged at the rate mentioned under the chapter "Fee, Funds and Other Charges", sub heading (D) Examination fee.

(B) STUDENTS CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Every student admitted to the University shall be required to give an undertaking to abide by the rules and regulations of the University and to carry out such other orders and instructions as may be issued by the University authorities from time to time under the University of Agriculture, Faisalabad, Students (Discipline and Conduct) Regulations, 1978 which are given below:

In pursuance with the orders dated 10.03.1993, announced by the Honourable Supreme Court of Pakistan in H.R. cases No.43/92 etc. the admitted students are also required to submit affidavit/undertaking on judicial paper that they will desist from indulgence in "Politics" during their study period at this University as well as its Sub-Campuses, otherwise the findings/decision of the University shall be final and not be questioned except only before the Supreme Court of Pakistan.

**UNIVERSITY OF AGRICULTURE, FAISALABAD, STUDENTS
(DISCIPLINE AND CONDUCT) REGULATIONS, 1978**

1. SHORT TITLE, COMMENCEMENT AND APPLICATION:

- (i) These Regulations may be called the University of Agriculture, Faisalabad Students(Discipline and Conduct) Regulations, 1978.
- (ii) These Regulations shall come into force with immediate effect.
- (iii) These Regulations shall apply to all students on the rolls of the University, including the Sub-Campuses.
- (iv) A student on the rolls of the University who violates these

Regulations shall be guilty of indiscipline and misconduct and liable to disciplinary action being taken against him under these Regulations.

2. DEFINITIONS:

Unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context, the expressions used in these Regulations and defined or used in the University of Agriculture, Faisalabad Act, 1973, shall have the meanings assigned to them, respectively, hereunder or in the Act.

- (a) "*Authority*" means any of the Authorities of the University specified in section 21 of the University of Agriculture, Faisalabad Act, 1973;
- (b) "*Chairman of Department*" means head of a teaching Department;
- (c) "*Chancellor*" means the Chancellor of the University;
- (d) "*Competent Authority*" means an Officer or Authority of the University competent to take disciplinary action against a University student guilty of misconduct and indiscipline;
- (e) "*Dean*" means the Chairman of the Board of the Faculty;
- (f) "*Director*" means the head of a teaching Division or a Directorate of the University;
- (g) "*Discipline Committee*" means the Discipline Committee, as constituted under paragraph 11 of the First Statutes appended to the University of Agriculture, Faisalabad Act, 1973, as amended from time to time;
- (h) "*Faculty*" means a Faculty of the University;
- (i) "*Penalty*" means a penalty which may be imposed under these Regulations;
- (j) "*Head of Sub-Campus*" means the Head or Principal of Sub-Campus.
- (k) "*Pro Chancellor*" means the Pro Chancellor of the University;
- (l) "*Statutes*," "*Regulations*" and "*Rules*" means respectively, the Statutes, the Regulations and the Rules made or deemed to have been made under the University of Agriculture, Faisalabad, Act, 1973.
- (m) "*Syndicate*" means the Syndicate of the University;
